Breakfast Club and Treetops Wraparound Care

We offer wraparound care from 8am to 4.45pm (4.15pm on Friday's).

If you wish to attend from 8am, you will be asked to pay £1.10 on Parentpay for the full 40 minute session. For clarity, 30 minutes of the sessions will therefore be free as the government has provided funding.

Breakfast Club offers light breakfasts options, such as toast, cereal, fruit and juice.

Treetops also can offer light snack choices and the cost per hour is £5, payable on Parentpay. Choose from the 3.15pm – 4.15pm (£5) or 4.15pm – 4.45pm (£2.50) **or** both sessions. Please note: Fridays are till 4.15pm only.

All sessions need booking on Parentpay.

We are taking monthly bookings payable in advance on Parentpay please. Cut off time to book is the THURSDAY 5PM for the following week. For bookings after this time, please email Mrs Grubb/Mrs Tonkin on luxulyansecretary@lux.celtrust.org

Please could you let us know 48 hours prior to your booking if you have to cancel. Uncancelled bookings may incur a charge as we have to organise staff in advance.

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Our Curriculum

'Our curriculum has been designed for the children of Luxulyan School to achieve both their academic potential and to leave school equipped with skills they will need throughout later life. To enable pupils to understand the world around them and the talents within them. We aim to provide an education for a connected world with opportunities that inspire creative learning and nurture aspirations; preparing our children to live knowledgeably, responsibly, and safely in a Modern Britain and the Wider World.'

Curriculum

Here at Luxulyan School we provide a broad and balanced curriculum using a number of approaches which are outlined on our subject curriculum pages.

We use the Opening Worlds resources for years 3 to 6 for our History, Geography and RE Curriculum. 'Opening Worlds is a knowledge-rich humanities programme for teaching history, geography and religion in Years 3 to 6.'

We believe children learn better when they are encouraged to use their imagination and apply their learning to engaging contexts. Our curriculum provides many learning challenges throughout the academic year that require children to solve problems, apply themselves creatively and express their knowledge and understanding effectively.

Our curriculum provides a rigorous skills and knowledge framework that outlines the end of year expectations in all subjects. These skills and knowledge are tied to activities and are age-related so that staff can track children's progress and identify their individual learning needs.





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Parentpay at Luxulyan School

In an attempt to reduce cash and cheques in school we use the ParentPay app - a more convenient way to pay for trips, school dinners, swimming etc.

What does ParentPay do?

- enables you to pay for school dinners and other items such as school trips, our wrap around clubs etc
- offers a highly secure payment site
- gives you a history of all the payments you have made
- allows you to create a single account login across all your children that attend a ParentPay school
- shows you all items available for payment relevant to each of your children
- emails a receipt of your payment to the email address you register
- offers you the ability to set automated email/SMS payment reminders

How does ParentPay help you?

- gives you the freedom to make payments to school whenever and wherever you like
- stops you having to write cheques or search for cash to send to school
- gives you peace of mind that your payment has been made safely and securely
- helps with budgeting; payments are immediate, there is no waiting for cheques to clear
- payments for many of the larger trips can be made by instalments up to the due date
- you will never need miss a payment, or have insufficient credit, with automated email/SMS alerts
- ParentPay is quick and easy to use

How does ParentPay help our school?

- reduces the administrative time spent on banking procedures
- keeps accurate records of payments made to every service for every student
- payments do not bounce
- reduces paper 'waste'
- allows for easy and quick refunds to be made back to the payment card
- improves communication between the school and parents concerning payments
- offers a more efficient payment collection process, reducing the amount of money held on school premises
- helps us improve school-home communication with its integrated email/SMS messaging centre



How do I get started?

Shortly after your child starts at Luxulyan School, we will send you a letter with a unique activation username and password (you will be prompted to change these and to keep them safe and secure as your Username and Password for future logins) so that you can activate your account.

If you have more than one child at a ParentPay school/s you can add them to a single account, providing one login for all children at ParentPay schools

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School Lunches

Our delicious meals are cooked on site by Caterlink. There is a nutritious, healthy menu which always includes a vegetarian option.

The government fund free school meals called Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM), for all children in EYFS (Ash Class) and Keystage 1 Children (Beech Class).

This is not to be confused with Benefits Related Free School Meals Auto Award Scheme.

Parents of Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 (KS2) children are asked to pay for their school dinners in advance on Parentpay. A school dinner costs £2.70, free to children in receipt Free School Meals Auto Award Scheme.

From September 2026, the Department for Education (DfE) will change the eligibility criteria for free school meals:

- All households on Universal Credit will qualify. Income limits will no longer apply
- Free school meal entitlement will no longer be 'protected' once awarded. Instead, eligibility will need to be checked at the start of each new school year

To support these changes and reduce administrative burden on families and schools, they will introduce an 'Auto Award' system.

- All existing claims will be rechecked before the start of each new academic year
- Checks will also run each term to find pupils who have become eligible
- If a family's situation changes between checks, they can still apply using the Synergy Enquiry system

The term's menus are emailed to parents/carers in advance and are also available from the school office and on our website. If your child brings a packed lunch we encourage this to be as healthy as possible.

School Meal Debt Policy

Cornwall Education Learning Trust has adopted a strict no debt policy relating to the school meals service.

If debts are incurred, then the school budget has to pay for them. This means that money which should have been spent on the children's education is used to pay for debts incurred by parents. Every parent will agree that this is unacceptable and we request that all parents give this policy their full support.

Parents must pay in advance for a school lunch, ideally using the school's ParentPay system. Children will not be provided with a school lunch unless it is paid for, except those that are entitled to Free School Meals. If a parent genuinely forgets to pay in advance, the school may grant a debt allowance of 1 meal. However, this debt must be paid with 1 week and future meals must be paid for in advance before any meal is provided.

For non-payment days, where the school is unable to contact the parents, and therefore has to provide the child with a lunch, the school will provide the child with a standard meal (i.e. whatever is on the



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menu that day). If, however, it is discovered that the child has forgotten to bring a packed lunch after the school has finished serving the main meal the school's kitchen will do their best to provide them with a cold lunch (i.e. sandwiches and fruit).

Important Information

Holidays during Term Time

The law changed in September 2013 and schools no longer have the freedom to allow parents to take their children out of school. Under current regulations, Headteachers may not grant authorised leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstance. Applications for 'Exceptional Circumstance leave' must be submitted to the school office at least 15 days before taking your child out of school. You can be fined during term time if you take our children out of school without permission.

If you are taking your child out of school for a holiday, or any other event, then an Exceptional Circumstance Leave Request Notice to Parents/Carers form must be completed prior to the absence. The form can be obtained from the school office.

Lateness

Our school gates open at 8.40am. If your child enters school after this time they will be marked as Late. After 9.30am, children will be marked as unauthorised. Please bring your child to school on time.

Reporting Absences

If your child is going to be absent from school due to illness, then please inform the school office before 8.40am in the morning and let us know why your child is going to be absent and when you expect them to return. If your child is off for more than one day, we must still be informed each day of your child's absence until they return to school.

Please note in instances of sickness and/or diarrhoea, please keep your child off school for 48 hours, timed from the last occurrence.

Please leave a message on each day of your child's absence telling us:

1. Your child's name
2. Class
3. Why they are absent (not just unwell)
4. When you expect them to return

Medication

Medicines should only be administered at school when it is detrimental to a child's health or school attendance not to do so. The school will require parental written consent to be given prescription or non-prescription medicines. When pain relief medication is given, it must not contain aspirin unless prescribed by a doctor. Maximum dosages and when the previous dose was taken will be checked and parents/carers will be informed.

Calpol can be given in school, if we have written consent.

Medical Appointments

If you need to take your child out of school for any length of time to attend a medical appointment, the school office must be notified in advance. We may also ask to see the letter confirming the date and time of the medical appointment. Please ensure that, where possible, medical appointments are made outside of school time.



Attendance

At Luxulyan School, we want every child to enjoy an exceptional educational experience that helps them to achieve their very best. Regular attendance plays a crucial role in this, as children who attend school consistently not only make stronger academic progress but also build confidence, resilience and positive friendships.

Even a small amount of absence can add up over time. This can make it harder for children to keep up with lessons, feel settled, and make the most of the opportunities school has to offer. We fully understand that there will be times when absence is unavoidable, such as illness or exceptional circumstances. Our priority is always to work with you in supporting your child.

We continue to recognise that there are occasions when it is appropriate to authorise an absence, such as when your child is too ill to attend school, however, the Government does not support parents/carers taking children out of school unless the school agrees this is appropriate under 'exceptional circumstances'.

We ask if you believe your situation meets the criteria for exceptional circumstances, please make a request for leave in writing to the Headteacher using the school's 'Leave of Absence Request Form' before the event. The form is available from the school office or website.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days.

Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

'Parent' as set out in Section 576 of the Education Act 1996, defines parent to include: natural parents, whether they are married or not; any person or body who has parental responsibility for a child (as defined by the Children Act 1989) and; any person who, although not a natural parent, has care of a child. Having care of a child means a person with whom a child lives and who looks after a child, irrespective of what their relationship is with said child.



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We know that family life can sometimes be complicated, and we are here to support you every step of the way. If you're unsure about anything in this letter, or if you're facing challenges that may impact your child's attendance, please don't hesitate to get in touch with us. Our team is always happy to listen and work with you to find the best solution. By working in partnership, we can ensure that your child receives the very best start in life and enjoys every opportunity to thrive here with us.

Coat Any suitable waterproof coat with hood.

No branded requirement — any colour or retailer.

Shoes

Plain black, leather or leather-look, formal style. No trainers, boots, heels or coloured trim

PE

Top Plain green t-shirt Optional PE hoodie with school logo

PE Shorts/Bottoms Plain black shorts or joggers/tracksuit bottoms in colder weather. No logo required.

Trainers

Safe, sturdy trainers of any colour or black velcro plimsolls. Any brand.

Hair

Long hair (shoulder length or longer) must be tied back. Natural colour only. No extreme styles, tram lines, or very short grades.

Jewellery

One pair of plain small ear studs only. Studs must be removed for PE. No other jewellery. No smart watches.
